Dearly Beloved,

God *is* our refuge and strength, A very present help in trouble. ² Therefore we will not fear, Even though the earth be removed, And though the mountains be carried into the midst of the sea; ³ *Though* its waters roar *and* be troubled, *Though* the mountains shake with its swelling. (Psalm 46:1-3)

Those are strong words upon which we can take our stand as we live as God's people in a world which increasingly opposes God and His Word. For though the devil and the world rage against God's will and Word, and threaten God's people in the process, God Himself is in charge and He is in control, even when it seems He's not. He is our refuge and strength and He will sustain His holy people and deliver them from all danger and harm and from every evil.

On Sunday, October 25, we will celebrate the festival of the Reformation (the actual date is October 31), the anniversary of Martin Luther posting the 95 Theses. Now this is not a festival in which we celebrate the events of our Lord's life, such as Christmas (His birth), Epiphany (His revelation to the Gentiles), Lent (His passion and death), Easter (His resurrection), and Ascension. It doesn't celebrate a Biblical event such as Pentecost. And it is most certainly not a celebration of Martin Luther and *his* life, or a Lutheran Independence Day of sorts.. Rather, Reformation Day is a festival of the Gospel. For it was through His servant Martin Luther that God brought the Gospel, that we are justified by grace alone through faith alone on account of Christ alone, back into the light of day, and restored its place as the central teaching of the Church.

But Luther did not enter into the Reformation lightly or willingly. Listen to Luther's own words:

Oh, with how great an effort and exertion, also with proof from Holy Scripture, did I barely succeed in justifying before my own conscience that I, a lone man, dared rise against the pope, consider him the Antichrist, the bishops his apostles, the schools of higher learning his houses of ill fame! How often my heart struggled, rebuked me, and threw up to me their one and strongest argument: You alone are wise? Can it be that all the others are erring and have been erring for so long a time? What if you are erring and leading into error so many people, all of whom will be eternally damned? Such questions continued until Christ strengthened and settled me by His own certain Word so that my heart no longer struggles but confronts these arguments of the papists as a rock-bound shore [confronts] the waves and laughs at their threatening and storming. (Plass, "What Luther Says", 3756)

It was the Word and promises of God, that is, Christ Himself, which gave Luther the confidence to continue the work which had begun. Indeed, Luther felt the earth quake all around him as he was declared a heretic and an outlaw. His life was on the line. Yet, strengthened by God's Word, he boldly proclaimed the saving Gospel of Jesus Christ in all its fullness and power.

So the next time you sing "A Mighty Fortress is Our God," remember Psalm 46, the Scripture upon which it is based and learn the entire Psalm by heart. Give thanks to God for restoring the saving Gospel of Jesus Christ to the Church. Indeed, "God is our refuge and strength" because He has saved us from sin, death, the devil, and hell. With His mighty arm He delivers us out of our wandering in a barren land and into the promised land of our eternal rest, which abounds with milk and honey. God grant you such strength, comfort, and peace as you trust and treasure His Word evermore.
