Dearly Beloved of Christ,

I borrowed/adapted the following from another pastor:

Our Divine Service liturgy is built around the Ordinary. Just as its name implies, these are the parts of the service that are not ordinarily omitted or changed. These parts include the Kyrie eleison ("Lord, have mercy"), the Gloria ("Glory to God in the highest"), the Credo ("I believe in one God"), the Offertory, and the parts of the Lord's Supper including the Preface, Sanctus ("Holy, Holy, Holy"), The Lord's Prayer, Agnus Dei ("Lamb of God"), and the Benediction.

The Ordinary provides continuity week-to-week, is easily learned and memorized, and becomes an essential part of our Christian vocabulary. In addition to the Ordinary are the Propers, the elements that change each week. The Propers are unique to each Sunday and occasionally to each service during festivals. The Propers include the readings assigned (lectionary), the collect for the day (prayer), the gradual, alleluia verse, tract, or sequence (responses to readings), the proper preface, and the hymn of the day.

Through the Ordinary and the Propers, we receive a service that is in continuity with the previous and upcoming weeks but also has its own specific focus or emphasis. During the festival season from Advent through Holy Trinity, this is on the work of Christ for our salvation. During the season after Trinity Sunday (May 26 this year), marked by green paraments and vestments, we grow in Christ through His teaching.

The hymn of the day is the newest of the Propers. While the appointed readings, prayers, and our liturgy are usually at least a millennia old in their use, the congregation in most places did not have the opportunity to sing. One of the fundamental tenets of the Lutheran reformation was to put the Scriptures in the hands and upon the lips of all the people of God. Hence, the Scriptures were translated into the native language of the people and the hymns of the church were composed as sung sermons on the assigned texts for the day.

Lutheran Service Book is an excellent resource to teach this tradition of the Reformation. On the bottom of each hymn page you will find the composer of the text and of the tune. Even more helpful are the various Scriptures directly or indirectly referenced in the hymn. From this you learn that our hymns are not merely idle speculation about God but are the Word of God recomposed to be sung.

Since the Reformation gave a voice to the people to confess with singing, our churches have also appointed a new proper, the hymn of the day. This hymn is specifically chosen because

it is a strong confession of the themes of the readings and especially the Gospel. Often it was composed specifically for a Sunday in the church year.

One such hymn, "Christ Jesus Lay in Death's Strong Bands," is designated for Easter Day. Martin Luther specifically composed the text of this hymn for that celebration. He took the text of the sequence hymn for Easter, Victimae Paschali (LSB 460), and wrote a hymnic meditation on the same theme. This magnificent and ancient hymn from the 11th century was expanded and clarified by Luther in his hymn version.

Through the singing of these ancient and more recent hymns, we receive the faith of our Fathers, the apostles, and the very Word of God spoken by our Lord Himself. As these hymns are sung over and over again, we learn them by heart and they become an increasing part of our faith and life.

Now a note from me: We do not sing all of the Hymn of the Day selections for various reasons. Oftentimes it's because I don't think we know them. (Yes, I know, I select other hymns you don't know.) Yet, contrary to what some may think, I do not choose hymns to intentionally stump or upset you. I try my best to select hymns that reflect the readings, the theme of the day, or the season of the Church Year, AND that are fairly singable or easy to learn. There are some hymns that are really difficult or just not as strong as others, and I try to avoid those. Still, even if you don't know a hymn (or can't sing it), at least follow along by reading the words. You will be richly blessed.
