Dearly Beloved of Christ,

As we approach the end of one Church year and beginning of another, two things come to mind. The first is that time is both linear and cyclical. That is, time marches on like an ever-flowing stream. It can't be captured to re-live again. Once it's past, it's past. It will continue until our Lord returns in glory and judgment on the Last Day. We get a glimpse of the glory of that day on All Saints' Day (November 2) when we hear about the saints gathered around the heavenly throne singing praises to God and to the Lamb. (Rev. 7:9-17). That's the future of all who trust in Christ alone for the forgiveness of sin, life, and salvation.

Likewise, time is also cyclical. That is, it goes round and round. We see this when we celebrate, or at least remember, birthdays, wedding anniversaries, or the death of a loved one. As the secular calendar contains many holidays that occur each year, so does the church. The secular calendar celebrates New Year's Day (maybe), Memorial Day, Independence Day, Labor Day, and New Year's Eve, as well as days of commemoration and remembrance of those thought worthy of being remembered, such as Presidents, Martin Luther King, Jr. Christopher Columbus, and Veterans.

So also, the Church has certain days (and seasons) that are celebrated each year, usually focused on the life of Christ – Advent, Christmas, the Epiphany, the Transfiguration, Ash Wednesday, Lent, Palm Sunday, Holy (Maundy) Thursday, Good Friday, Easter, the Ascension, and Pentecost. Of course, the world also acknowledges Christmas and Easter, but strips them of their true meaning and significance. In addition, the Church has identified many more feasts and festivals worth celebrating, as well as commemorations. (Please see pages xi through xiii in Lutheran Service Book).

"So what?", you may ask. Just this, time is a creation and gift from God. The Scriptures tells of both the linear and circular nature of time. God Himself wanted certain days and events remembered and celebrated, especially remind His people of His love and saving work for them. It behooves us to use the time we have been allotted to His purposes and His glory. That's why we repeatedly and regularly gather in His House with His holy people to receive His gifts. It is His desire for us for we never outgrow our need for His saving gifts.

Between the end of the church year and the beginning of the next, we will celebrate the bountiful gifts our Lord so graciously gives us and give thanks for them on Thanksgiving Eve (Nov. 26 at 7:00 pm). Please join us.

The End is coming. Do not fear. Your Lord is with you always.
