Dearly Beloved of Christ,

One of my devotional readings a few weeks ago, included this quote from Martin Luther. Its setting is the plague that was rampant at the time and the importance of notifying the pastor when his services were needed.

[How to prepare for death:] First, one must admonish the people to attend church and listen to the sermon so that they learn through God's word how to live and how to die. It must be noted that those who are so uncouth and wicked as to despise God's word while they are in good health should be left unattended when they are sick unless they demonstrate their remorse and repentance with great earnestness, tears, and lamentation. . . .

Second, everyone should prepare in time and get ready for death by going to confession and taking the sacrament once every week or fortnight. He should become reconciled with his neighbor and make his will so that if the Lord knocks and he departs before a pastor or chaplain can arrive, he has provided for his soul, has left nothing undone, and has committed himself to God. When there are many fatalities and only two or three pastors on duty, it is impossible to visit everyone, to give instruction, and to teach each one what a Christian ought to know in the anguish of death. Those who have been careless and negligent in these matters must account for themselves. That is their own fault. After all, we cannot set up a private pulpit and altar daily at their bedside simply because they have despised the public pulpit and altar to which God has summoned and called them.

Third, if someone wants the chaplain or pastor to come, let the sick person send word in time to call him and let him do so early enough while he is still in his right mind before the illness overwhelms the patient. [So far Luther]

While we are, thankfully, not afflicted with the plague, I share this with you as encouragement to attend the Divine Service as often as you can, because it is the primary way of preparing to die. That, after all, is what I'm here for, to prepare you to die – in Christ – through preaching, teaching, and administering the Sacrament. This helps you to live your life in this world looking ever forward to living in the world to come. This should be the most important thing in your life. So, please call me whenever you need the comfort and strength of the Gospel.

Related to this is encouragement to speak to family members and friends who may be absent from the Divine Service, and thus neglecting God's Word and preparing to live eternally. Invite them, encourage them, and bring them with you to receive God's gifts and thus prepare to die. It's the greatest thing you can do for them.

God bless you as you prepare to die in Christ by hearing His Word, receiving His forgiveness, and then, empowered by Him and His Gospel, living a life that pleases Him.
