Dearly Beloved of Christ,

Each year as we celebrate the Festival of the Reformation, it's an opportunity to go back to the basics of our faith. Some in his day thought that Martin Luther was the angel with an eternal gospel to proclaim as is stated in Revelation 15:6-7, the first reading appointed for the day. And there was some justification for that since Luther was concerned about the Gospel in every way because it is the message of our salvation from sin, death, and the devil. Then again, the same could be said of every faithful pastor who preaches the saving Gospel of Christ in its fullness and purity.

And while the main theme of the Reformation was/is a proper understanding of justification, it was also emphasized that this teaching is based on Scripture (the Bible) alone. This second point is critical because there is no other source from which we learn the full truth about God and our standing before Him. If God had not revealed it to us in His Word, we would never have been able to come up with it ourselves. Indeed, we (mankind) did and do try to come up with ways to please God, but they all fail. That's why it good to constantly review what the Bible says about our justification.

The first thing we learn is that we are sinners through and through. By nature we are dead in our trespasses and sins (Eph. 2:1) and are enemies of God (Rom. 5:10). We can do nothing to please God. "For by works of the law no human being will be justified in his sight, since through the law comes knowledge of sin." (Rom. 3:20). We deserved nothing but eternal death, eternal separation from God, eternal punishment in hell.

But rather than give us what we deserve, God does the unthinkable (at least to us). He provides a way to save us. He sends His only Son, the second person of the Holy Trinity, to become flesh in order to keep the law perfectly in every respect, including suffering the punishment for our sins, not His. Jesus kept the Law and He paid the price, the penalty, that our sins deserve. He paid our ransom price so that we could be restored to God's family.

What a gracious gift! "For all have sinned and fall short of the glory of God, and are justified by his grace as a gift, through the redemption that is in Christ Jesus, whom God put forward as a propitiation by his blood, to be received by faith." (Rom. 3:23-25). This is the core of the Gospel. We poor, miserable sinners can stand before God because Jesus died for our sins. More than that, God has revealed it to us and even causes us to believe it. That faith by which we believe in Jesus and all that He has done for us is God's gracious gift to us (Eph. 2:8-9). Our salvation, our justification, is all His work from beginning to end.

That's what God brought to light through His servant Martin Luther. It's a glorious gift that we receive by faith and in which we live before God now and forever.

3 O Comforter of priceless worth, Send peace and unity on earth; Support us in our final strife And lead us out of death to life.
